Funds raised by this non-voted levy under SB307 can be spent only for the cost to repair/replace the foundation of the school building and the teacherage.


#### Annual Arts and Crafts Fair

#### AIR DRY CLAY RECIPE

- 11/2 cups cornstarch
- 1 cup white school glue
- 1 Tablespoon white vinegar
- 1 teaspoon lotion
- 1 Tablespoon baby oil

Mix all ingredients together in a large mixing bow till smooth. Chances are your clay will still be sticky. Start with the ingredient amounts listed above and slowly add cornstarch a little at a time until the mixture can hold no more. Soon the clay will go from sticky to smooth, stretchy, and super soft. Prepare a clean counter with extra cornstarch spread out much like you are rolling out a pie crust. Dust a little corn starch on your hands as well. Turn clay out onto counter and knead it like dough. If it's still sticky add more cornstarch. At this point the clay is ready to use. Mold it, let it dry- it's really that simple. The drying time will depend on the thickness of the finished clay product.
